Foundation provides for students

Ready or not, anywhere between 2.9 million and 3.3 million public school students graduate high school every year. But due to financial hardships and lack of resources and opportunities, many of our local brightest and best will not go off to college after graduating.

The Z-Man Scholarship Foundation works to support the disadvantaged but determined! A college degree can be a catalyst out of poverty, offering the chance at a better job, greater lifetime earnings, even better lifetime health. But the persistent educational gap affecting poor and minority students in Oregon means many students never get a chance to earn a college degree.

We believe that college preparation and mentoring programs can change that.

In recent decades, the economic returns on a college degree have risen sharply. The income gap between graduates and non-graduates is
