Eligibility criteria

To qualify for the award, a youth must meet all the following requirements:

- An enrolled student entering 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade, including transfer students.
- Must be qualified for the maximum amount of financial assistance for either La Salle, De La Salle North Catholic and Seton Catholic high schools.
- Student must carry at least a 2.0 GPA.
- Ability to pass the placement test with La Salle, De La Salle North and Seton Catholic high schools.
- Must meet the acceptance requirements and have completed the application and financial assistance form for the chosen school.

In addition, any youth who participates in the Gang Resistance Education and Training (G.R.E.A.T.), and meets the grade criteria is eligible for this scholarship.

Selection is based on commitment to public service, academic achievements and potential for an ongoing leadership role in the community.

Selection process

- Nominee materials must be received by Friday, Jan. 17, 2014.
- The selection committee will review all written essays and nominee materials.
- Each nominee and their parent/guardian will be interviewed.
- Following the interviews, the selection committee will determine the recipients of the Z-Man Scholarship.

Scholarship recipients must:

- Participate in the Portland Police Bureau mentorship program.
- Attend an end-of-year Portland Police Bureau update interview.
- Maintain at least a 2.0 GPA at all times during their high school careers.
- Participate in and volunteer for the Foundation's major fundraising events in 2014.



"Z Man"

Mark Y. Zylawy, "Z Man," a highly regarded Portland police officer, died January 27, 2008 in a traffic accident at the age of 40. He worked as a district officer in Northeast Portland for 17 years with a passion, dedication and enthusiasm. Officer Zylawy earned the respect of his fellow officers and community members by the way he lived his life – with the values of the Portland Police organization – integrity, compassion, accountability, respect, excellence and service.

Officer Zylawy was born in Versailles, France, and moved to Montana where he graduated from high school in 1986. He received a Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from Montana State University in 1990 and moved to Oregon the same year. He then became an officer with the Portland Police Bureau.

Officer Zylawy was recognized for his superior police service receiving 30 commendations, two unit citations, and the Medal of Valor from the Bureau. "Z Man" was a dedicated Field Training Officer. Officer Zylawy was an officer with a high moral and ethical standard and showed a high degree of dedication to his duty as a police officer while striving to improve the organization and the community where he worked. His service on a day-to-day basis in Northeast Portland, with compassion and respect, made a lasting and significant impact on the northeast community and its residents.
