Talent Within Official Rules

Entrants

- 1) You must currently be a student attending any of the sponsored high schools named in the talent competition.
- 2) Students must have a current cumulative GPA of 2.0 in order to participate in the competition by competition night and maintain said GPA for the finals if they qualify.
- 3) Participant(s) must register and turn in all signed release forms with required information and signatures before March 30, 2015
- 4) Single and or Group entries are authorized. In the event that a group wins the prize scholarship money will be divided equally among all group members.

Professional acts/adult participation

- 1) If you currently receive or have ever received any monetary compensation for your "talent" you are considered a professional entertainer and will not be allowed to participate in the talent competition.
- 2) You may be supported by others (not current students and or adults) but not to the extent where their participation is equal to or greater than your performance.
- 3) Back-up vocals, musicians (who are not students and or adults) will be allowed as long as their participation is equal to and not greater than your performance.

Entertainment Guidelines

- 1) The maximum length of performance will be 4 minutes.
- 2) Set up and tear down of props cannot go over 6 minutes.
- 3) Lyrics, dance moves and acts must be appropriate and reasonable for a family environment involving young school age children. No offensive language, no suggestive dance moves, no acts of violence or any other act or behavior that would diminish from the spirit of the mission of the Zman Scholarship Foundation will be allowed.
- 4) Any political statement or form there of will be prohibited.

Scholarship Guidelines

To receive "Talent Within" scholarship funds, winner must contact Z-Man Scholarship Foundation at 503-572-1187. All student scholarship recipients understand the following:

- 1) Scholarship funds will be awarded for tuition of universities, colleges and other institutions of higher learning ("Higher Learning Institutions"). The executive board of the Z-Man Scholarship Foundation may consider and agree to provide scholarship funds for tuition at other types of learning institutions in the executive board's sole discretion.
- 2) Scholarship funds are awarded solely for tuition at Higher Learning Institutions. Scholarship funds are not awarded for any other expenses, for example, housing, incidentals and other expenses of education.
- 3) Scholarship funds will be used no later than two years after the date of graduation from high school, unless deferred for military service.
- 4) A student scholarship recipient will provide a statement that indicates the tuition due from the Higher Learning Institution to the Z-Man Scholarship Foundation. The Z-Man Scholarship Foundation will deliver the scholarship funds directly to the Higher Learning Institution based on the tuition statement. If a student scholarship recipient withdraws from the Higher Learning Institution, then any unused scholarship funds will be returned to the Z-Man Scholarship Foundation.
- 5) Any requests for variation from the above guidelines must be presented to the executive board of the Z-Man Scholarship Foundation. The decisions of the executive board of the Z-Man Scholarship Foundation in granting scholarships and delivering scholarship funds are made in the executive board's sole discretion.

The "Z-Man" Scholarship Foundation was established in honor of Officer Mark Zylawy and his dedication to duty as a police officer while striving to improve the organization and the community where he worked.
